Western Power's Proposed Revisions to the Access Arrangement for the Western Power Network –Errata sheet received from Western Power

TIME EXTENDED FOR PUBLIC SUBMISSIONS

The Economic Regulation Authority has extended the time for public submissions on Western Power's proposed revisions to its access arrangement for the Western Power Network, to Monday 5 December 2011.

The extension is made in response to an [errata sheet](#) provided by Western Power listing corrections and clarifications that should be considered when reviewing Western Power's access arrangement revisions submission that was submitted on 30 September 2011. It covers errata for the proposed revisions to the Access Arrangement, the Price List Information, the Access Arrangement Information and Appendix A of the Access Arrangement Information.

The Authority has determined that a time extension is necessary to properly consider all matters, and it is also satisfied that it has taken all reasonable steps to fully utilise the times and processes available within Chapter 4 of the Electricity Networks Access Code 2004. The extension has been provided pursuant to the requirements of sections 4.66(d) and 4.64 of the Access Code.

The Authority first published Western Power's proposed access arrangement revisions on 7 October with an accompanying [notice](#) inviting public submissions, which were to be lodged by Monday, 21 November 2011. The Authority has determined that a time extension of ten business days is necessary.

Interested parties are therefore advised that the revised deadline for submissions on Western Power's proposed access arrangement revisions is **4:00 pm (WST) on Monday, 5 December 2011**.

Confidentiality

Where an interested party wishes to make a submission in confidence, it should clearly indicate the parts of the submission for which confidentiality is claimed, and specify in reasonable detail the basis for the claim. Any claim of confidentiality will be considered in accordance with the provisions of the Access Code, sections 14.12 to 14.15.

The publication of a submission on the Authority's website shall not be taken as indicating that the Authority has knowledge either actual or constructive of the contents of a particular

submission and, in particular, whether the submission in whole or part contains information of a confidential nature and no duty of confidence will arise for the Authority.
