Proposed Revised Access Arrangement for the Goldfields Gas Pipeline

PUBLICATION OF ISSUES PAPER

The Economic Regulation Authority has published an <u>issues paper</u> on the proposed revised access arrangement for the Goldfields Gas Pipeline (GGP).

On 15 August 2014, Goldfields Gas Transmission Pty Ltd (GGT) as the complying service provider of the GGP submitted proposed revisions to the GGP access arrangement to the Authority.

The Authority issued a notice on 5 September 2014 advising of the receipt of GGT's proposed revised access arrangement and invited submissions from interested parties. On 16 October 2014, the Authority issued a notice which extended the consultation period. The Authority has decided to provide a further extension to allow 10 business days for submissions following the publication of the issues paper. The proposed revised access arrangement, access arrangement information and related documents are available on the Authority's website.

The issues paper has been prepared to assist interested parties in preparing submissions. The issues paper is not intended to be an exhaustive review of the proposed revised access arrangement for the GGP, or the matters that the Authority will address when making a draft decision on whether to approve or not approve the proposed revised access arrangement.

Invitation to Make Public Submissions

Interested parties are invited to make a submissions on the proposed revision to the GGP access arrangement before 4:00 pm (WST) Monday, 17 November 2014.
