2016 Sewerage, Water Supply and Irrigation Performance Data

SMALL SUPPLIERS

The Economic Regulation Authority (**ERA**) has published the small water supplier performance data for the year ending 30 June 2016. The performance data is available on the ERA [website](#).

Water and Sewerage Service Providers

Small water and sewerage service providers supply less than 1,000 connected properties. Small water licensees are required to report annually to the ERA, providing data for a range of non-financial performance indicators. The performance indicators are a sub-set of those that are reported by the larger service providers.¹

The water and sewerage data is presented separately in two datasheets, under the categories of:

- Water Resources;
- Asset Data;
- Customers;
- Environment (sewerage only); and
- Water Quality (water only).

Irrigation Service Providers

In previous years, the irrigation performance data only covered the two smaller irrigators in the State: Gascoyne Water Cooperative and Preston Valley Irrigation Cooperative. This has now been expanded to also include two larger irrigators: Harvey Water and Ord Irrigation Cooperative.²

The irrigation performance data categories are:

- Assets;
- Customers; and
- Network Supply.

¹ The performance indicators for both small and large water and sewerage service providers are defined in the National Water Commission's *2013-14 National Performance Framework: urban performance reporting indicators and definitions handbook*.

² The performance data for the two large irrigators was previously published in the ERA's *Water, Sewerage and Irrigation Performance Report*. Because of the limited dataset reported by irrigators, the ERA has decided to merge the small and large irrigator performance data.
