## Allowable Revenue and Forecast Capital Expenditure Proposal for the Australian Energy Market Operator

### **ISSUES PAPER**

The Economic Regulation Authority (**ERA**) has published an <u>issues paper</u> on the proposal from the Australian Energy Market Operator (**AEMO**) for allowable revenue and forecast capital expenditure for the period 1 July 2016 to 30 June 2019. The proposed funding is for AEMO's Market Operations and System Management functions and for its Gas Services Information (GSI) functions.

The Wholesale Electricity Market Rules (2015) and the Gas Services Information Rules (2015) require the ERA to assess and determine allowable revenue and forecast capital expenditure proposed by AEMO.

AEMO provided its <u>proposal</u> to the ERA on 16 September 2016. This proposal is available on the ERA's website.

This is AEMO's first allowable revenue submission since assuming responsibility for these functions on 30 November 2015, as part of the Energy Market Review being undertaken by the state government.

AEMO's submission replaces previous submissions made by the IMO and System Management in November 2015 and February 2016 respectively. Rule changes were made on 1 July 2016 deeming these submissions to have been withdrawn, and requiring AEMO to submit its own proposal by 16 September 2016. The ERA must make its determination by 16 December 2016.
