Shire of Lake Grace

Licence renewal application

The Shire of Lake Grace has applied to the Economic Regulation Authority to renew its water services licence <u>WL22</u>, which expires on 28 April 2021.

WL22 authorises the Shire to provide non-potable water and sewerage services to customers in Lake Grace, approximately 345 kilometres southeast of Perth. As at 30 June 2020, the Shire provided sewerage services to 318 connected properties.¹

The ERA invites public comment on the Shire's request to renew WL22.

To renew a licence, the ERA must be satisfied that the licensee:

- has, and is likely to retain,
 - or
- will acquire within a reasonable time after the renewal, and is then likely to retain

the financial and technical resources to undertake the activities authorised by the licence.

Section 13(2)(b) of the *Water Services Act* 2012 states that the ERA may renew a licence if it is satisfied that it would not be contrary to the public interest to do so. Section 46 of the Water Act sets out the matters the ERA must take into account (to the extent to which the ERA considers that they are relevant) when making a decision to renew a licence.

The ERA must also have regard to the public interest matters set out in section 26 of the *Economic Regulation Authority Act 2003*, which include the long-term interests of consumers.
