Minor amendments to electricity generation licence EGL7

The Economic Regulation Authority has approved minor amendments to the Electricity Generation and Retail Corporation's (trading as Synergy) electricity generation licence EGL7 to remove a number of licence area maps.

The maps have been removed from the licence because the associated generators have less than 30 megawatts nameplate capacity at the connection point or have been divested or retired.^{1,2}

The following licence area plans and associated references have been removed from the licence:

- ERA-EL-045A for Mungarra 2
- ERA-EL-047A for West Kalgoorlie 3
- ERA-EL-054A for Albany (windfarm)
- ERA-EL-058A for Bremer Bay (windfarm and diesel generator)
- ERA-EL-059B for Gasmere (windfarm)
- ERA-EL-060A for Esperance (10 mile lagoon windfarm)
- ERA-EL-061A for Esperance (9 mile beach windfarm)
- ERA-EL-064A for Hopetoun (windfarm and diesel generator)
- ERA-EL-065A for Coral Bay (windfarm and diesel generator)
- ERA-EL-091A for Kalbarri (windfarm)

The licensee applied to the ERA for the license amendments on 17 December 2021.

The ERA did not call for public consultation as it considered the amendments to be minor.

The amended licence EGL7 (version 14) is available on the ERA website.

Mungarra 2 has been retired, Albany and Grasmere windfarms have been divested, and the other generation sites have less than 30MW nameplate capacity at a connection point.

Under clause 3 of the Electricity Industry Exemption Order 2005, a person is exempt from requiring a licence for generating works that have a nameplate capacity less than 30 megawatts at the network connection point.
