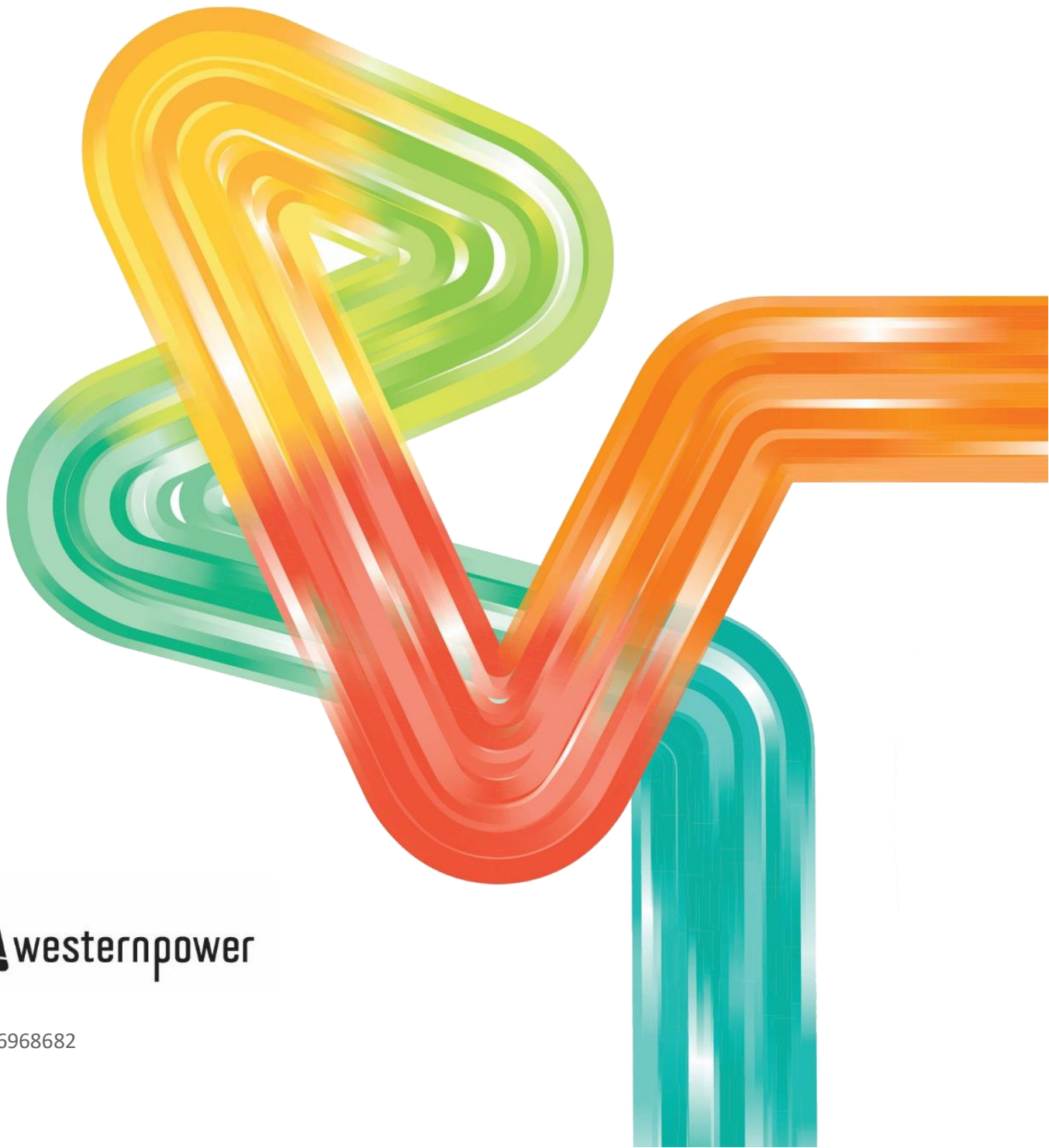

Model Electricity Transfer Access Contract (ETAC) Change Summary

Access Arrangement Information

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1. Introduction

The *model standard access contract* was replaced in July 2021 by Energy Policy WA with a *transitional standard access contract* to reflect new changes made to the Access Code.

The *transitional standard access contract* is included in Appendix 3 of the *Electricity Networks Access Code 2004* (the Code) and referred to in Chapter 5 with respect to reference services and the Code objective.

The requirements for the standard access contract defined in the Code are shown in the diagram below.

Figure 1: Standard access contract for each reference service¹

5.3 A standard access contract must be:

- (a) reasonable; and
- (b) sufficiently detailed and complete to:
 - (i) form the basis of a commercially workable access contract; and
 - (ii) enable a user or applicant to determine the value represented by the reference service at the reference tariff.

This document summarises the proposed changes to the *transitional standard access contract* for Access Arrangement 5 and the rationale for each of these proposed changes.

This summary document supports the proposed changes to Access Arrangement Appendix A: Electricity Transfer Access Contract, which details proposed changes in both “tracked change” mode and as an unmarked version.
