Australian Energy Market Operator's ancillary services requirements

Approval of 2022/23 ancillary services requirements

The Economic Regulation Authority has completed its audit of the Australian Energy Market Operator's ancillary services requirements and plan for 2022/23.

Ancillary services are required to maintain power system security and reliability and ensure that electricity supplies are of acceptable quality.

The Australian Energy Market Operator (AEMO) submits is requirements, including costs of those services for the previous year, to the ERA for audit and approval.

The ERA has approved all of AEMO's proposed changes to its ancillary services requirements for 2022/23 except for AEMO's proposed increase to its peak Load Following Ancillary Service (LFAS) requirement. The ERA approved +/-110 MW for the peak LFAS requirement, equal to the quantity that AEMO proposes to initially implement in 2022/23. AEMO may request the ERA to approve a variation to these requirements at any time.

These requirements are set out in AEMO's 2021/22 ancillary services report.
