BEI WWF Pty Ltd as Trustee for the WWF Trust

2022 Performance audit and asset management system review

The Economic Regulation Authority has published the 2022 <u>performance audit and asset management system review report</u> for BEI WWF Pty Ltd as Trustee for the WWF Trust's electricity generation licence EGL29.

BEI WWF owns and operates Warradarge Wind Farm under EGL29, which is a 180-megawatt wind farm near Eneabba in the Mid-West Region of Western Australia, approximately 260 kilometres north of Perth in the Shire of Coorow. The wind farm is connected to the South West Interconnected System.

The ERA's decision

The ERA considers that BEI WWF has achieved a high level of compliance with its licence and has an effective asset management system.

The ERA has decided to increase the audit and review period from 36 to 60 months. The next audit and review will cover the period 1 July 2022 to 30 June 2027, with the report due by 30 September 2027.

Audit and review findings

Audit

The audit of the 31 licence obligations applicable to BEI WWF found two minor non-compliances and no controls deficiencies. BEI WWF paid its standing charge after the due date on two occasions and did not include these non-compliances in its annual compliance reports to the ERA.

Review

The assessment of the 12 asset management system processes prescribed in the ERA's 2019 Audit and Review Guidelines: Electricity and Gas Licences found no asset management system deficiencies.
