Minor amendments to electricity generation licence EGL7

The Economic Regulation Authority has approved minor amendments to the Electricity Generation and Retail Corporation's (trading as Synergy) electricity generation licence EGL7 to remove three licence area plans from the licence.

Synergy applied to have the plans removed from the licence because the associated generators each have a total capacity of not more than 100 megawatts at the network connection point. Under clause 3 of the *Electricity Industry Exemption Order 2005*, a person is exempt from requiring a licence for generating works that have a capacity of not more than 100 megawatts at the connection point.¹

The following licence area plans and associated references have been removed from the licence:

- ERA-EL-063A for Denham
- ERA-EL-046A for Geraldton
- ERA-EL-057A for Kalbarri

Synergy applied to the ERA for the licence amendments on 27 October 2022.

The ERA considers the changes to the licence are minor amendments that do not require public consultation.
