Surrender of electricity generation licence EGL14

Alcoa of Australia Limited has notified the Economic Regulation Authority of its intention to surrender its electricity generation licence EGL14.

Alcoa is surrendering its licence because its three generating plants each have a capacity less than 100 MW. Under clause 3 of the *Electricity Industry Exemption Order 2005*, a person is exempt from requiring a licence for generating works that have a capacity of not more than 100 MW at the connection point.¹

The surrender of the licence will take effect when the ERA publishes a notice of the surrender in the Western Australian Government Gazette. The ERA will do this as soon as practicable.

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¹ On 22 October 2022, the Exemption Order was amended to increase the electricity generation exemption from 30 to 100 MW.
