Electricity Code Consultative Committee

Call for expressions of interest

The Economic Regulation Authority invites electricity licensees and consumer representative organisations to express their interest in joining the <u>Electricity Code Consultative Committee</u> for a two-year term. The ECCC is a statutory committee appointed by the Economic Regulation Authority.

Under the *Electricity Industry Act 2004*, the ECCC must review the *Code of Conduct for the Supply of Electricity to Small Use Customers* (the Code) and provide advice to the ERA every two years. The next review of the Code will commence once the ECCC is established.

The Code regulates and controls the conduct of retailers, distributors and electricity marketing agents who supply electricity to residential and small business customers. The Code was developed to protect the interests of customers who generally have little or no market power. For this reason, the Code only applies to residential and small business customers who consume less than 160 MWh of electricity per annum, with an annual electricity bill of approximately \$40,000 or less.

The ERA seeks four people from electricity licensees and four people from consumer representative organisations to join the ECCC. The ECCC members may be eligible for travel reimbursement and sitting fees.
