## 2025/26 price list for the Western Power network

### Determination

The Economic Regulation Authority has approved [Western Power's proposed 2025/26 price list](#).

Western Power is required to submit its price list for approval under Chapter 8 of the Electricity Networks Access Code 2004. We must approve the proposed prices if they are consistent with Western Powers approved access arrangement, including the tariff structure statement, and the Access Code.

Apart from generators and some very large customers, network charges are not directly charged to end users. Network charges are paid by retailers. The retailers decide how those charges will be passed on to end users along with other costs such as wholesale electricity.

The average increase in network tariffs from 2024/25 is 7.2 per cent. Charges for individual customers will vary depending on the type of tariff they are on, and their usage.

The average increase is in line with forecast in the ERA's final decision for Western Power's fifth access arrangement, published on 31 March 2023.

The [approved network prices](#) will commence on 1 July 2025.

The Western Australian Government determines the extent to which increases in network tariffs will affect regulated retail tariffs (for residential and small business customers) and regulated retail streetlighting tariffs (for local governments). These tariffs are generally set out in the annual State Budget.
