Public Submissions Invited on the Draft Customer Service Charter Guidelines

The Economic Regulation Authority is seeking public comment on draft Customer Service Charter Guidelines relevant to gas, water and electricity retailers and electricity distributors.

The customer service charter explains the services the company provides, customer's entitlements and other information about the relationship between the customer and the company.

The Customer Service Charter Guidelines aim to:

- describe the assorted charter information and review requirements in the gas, water and electricity industries; and
- explain the process of approval the Authority will undertake with regard to water charters and the process of review the Authority will undertake with regard to electricity charters. Whilst gas licensees are required to produce a charter the Authority does not review or approve these charters.
