Code of Conduct for the Supply of Electricity to Small Use Customers

CORRIGENDA

The Economic Regulation Authority today released a corrigenda advising that a correction has been made to the *Code of Conduct for the Supply of Electricity to Small Use Customers* (Code).

The Authority had found an error in the Code since publishing it on 3 October 2007. Despite the Authority deciding to reject the ECCC's Recommendation 34 on historical debt, the following words were included at the end of clause 4.5(3):

and, in relation to a bill which includes a historical debt (or part thereof) in the amount billed, the bill must separately identify the basis of the current and historic debts, including the address or addresses at which the electricity was consumed and the date/s of consumption

The corrigenda deletes this paragraph.

The Authority did not adopt the ECCC's Recommendation 34 as there were mixed stakeholder views on whether providing customers with further detail on current and historical debt would reduce confusion and disconnections.
