## PUBLIC SUBMISSIONS ARE INVITED ON DRAFT PUBLIC CONSULTATION GUIDELINES FOR ELECTRICITY, GAS AND WATER SERVICE LICENCES; STANDARD FORM CONTRACTS AND CUSTOMER SERVICE CHARTERS

The Economic Regulation Authority (Authority) is seeking public comment on draft public consultation guidelines for electricity, gas and water service licences; standard form contracts and customer service charters (draft public consultation guidelines) for service providers throughout Western Australia.

Under the *Economic Regulation Authority Act 2003*, the Authority is responsible for administering the licensing schemes referred to in the relevant industry Acts.

The electricity, gas and water industries are regulated by the requirements of the *Electricity Industry Act 2004*, *Energy Coordination Act 1994 and the Water Services Licensing Act 1995*.

A person or organisation intending to supply or sell electricity, gas and water in Western Australia must be licensed by the Authority unless exempted under the relevant Act.

The compilation of the draft public consultation guidelines:

- seeks to assist electricity, gas and water licence applicants improve the standard and quality of their licence applications, standard form contracts and customer service charters; and
- seeks input from the public and interested parties on the proposed guidelines.

For these reasons it is opportune to seek comment from stakeholders and the public on this issue.
