NewGen Power Kwinana Pty Ltd

2024 performance audit

The Economic Regulation Authority has published the <u>2024 performance audit report</u> and <u>post-audit implementation plan</u> for NewGen Power Kwinana Pty Ltd's electricity generation licence EGL3.

NewGen Power Kwinana operates the Kwinana Power Station, a 327.8 megawatt combined-cycle gas-fired power station located at the Kwinana industrial estate, 30 kilometres south of Perth. The power generated meets about 10 per cent of the electricity demand on the South West Interconnected System.

The ERA's decision

The ERA considers that NewGen Power Kwinana has achieved a high level of compliance with its licence and has decided to maintain the audit period at 60 months. The next audit will cover the period 1 August 2024 to 31 July 2029, with the report due to be provided by 31 October 2029.

Audit findings

The audit of the 37 licence obligations applicable to NewGen Power Kwinana found two minor non-compliances:

- Late payment of its 2021 licence fee to the ERA.
- Late submission of its 2019 standing data to the ERA and failure to include this noncompliance in its 2020 compliance report.¹

The recommendation to address the late payment of the ERA's licence fee was resolved during the audit period.

The auditor made one recommendation to address the remaining non-compliance. The post-audit implementation plan states that NewGen Power Kwinana will address the recommendation by 31 March 2025.

The ERA's assessment of the audit findings

The ERA considers that the non-compliances were minor administrative matters, which had no impact on NewGen Power Kwinana's ability to generate power.
