This would include a control to reliably prompt the responsible person, with sufficient notice to enable the task to be completed on time.  A requirement that the notification be documented and records stored by ADEWAP for assurance purposes in those cases where the notification is undertaken by other parties/teams (e.g. APA internal working groups).	The compliance plan for ADEWAP is maintained within the Vigilant system. This platform records regulatory obligations and links them with corresponding controls to ensure that any changes such as updates to contact details, address, ABN, or licensee information are communicated to relevant regulators and Code Participants within the prescribed timeframes.  Vigilant generates system-driven actions with sufficient notice for recurring regulatory requirements such as annual reporting and licence fee payments. Trigger-based compliance obligations, including obligation 452, are inherently event-driven. Consequently, they rely on internal awareness and communication processes rather than automated system prompts. The existing control in Vigilant for this obligation is dependent on human recognition and timely escalation of notifiable changes where feasible.  To ensure compliance with ad-hoc and trigger-based compliance obligations in relation to notification requirements, ADEWAP will:  • Conduct staff awareness sessions with key stakeholders to reinforce notification timeframes and internal assurance processes for record keeping in Vigilant.  • Include "regulatory notifiable changes" as a standing agenda item in existing cross-functional forums to provide a regular checkpoint for discussing upcoming organisational and personnel changes, enabling pre-emptive external notifications where possible.
