Parron Maam Marang Farm

Application for an electricity generation licence – Invitation for public submissions

The Economic Regulation Authority is seeking public comment on the application submitted by Atmos Parron Wind Farm Pty Ltd as trustee for the Atmos Parron Wind Farm Trust for an electricity generation licence, pursuant to section 7 of the *Electricity Industry Act 2004*.

This application is for the construction and operation of a 484 Megawatt wind farm, known as the Parron Maam Marang Farm, comprised of 78 wind turbine generators and associated electrical infrastructure for connection to the South West Interconnected System.

The wind farm will be located in the northern Wheatbelt region in the localities of Badgingarra and Hill River within the Shire of Dandaragan, approximately 200 kilometres north of Perth

The licence may be granted only if the ERA is satisfied that:

- the licence is not contrary to the public interest; and
- the applicant has and is likely to retain, or will acquire within a reasonable time after the grant of the licence and is then likely to retain, the financial and technical resources to undertake the activities authorised by the licence.

Related companies of the applicant hold licences for electricity generation in relation to wind farms in Victoria, South Australia and Tasmania.

The Parron Maam Marang Farm is one of the [priority projects](#) designated by the Coordinator General on 30 June 2026. [Priority projects](#) are projects that the Minister for State Development, on the recommendation of the Coordinator General, considers strategically or economically significant to Western Australia.

Development of this wind farm project has been undertaken by Zephyr Energy Pty Ltd under a joint development arrangement between Atmos WAN Holdings Pty Ltd and Parron Developments Pty Ltd. Prior to construction, the project assets and associated contractual rights will transfer to the applicant, which will become the owner and operator of the wind farm.

When considering the application, the ERA must also have regard to the public interest matters set out in section 26 of the *Economic Regulation Authority Act 2003*, which include the long-term interests of consumers.
